1. Promotion and development

Given the objectives set for 2015, we managed the following activities:

1.1 Project promotion through online resources. Development of the project's web page

The promotion of the project was carried out during 2015 through a series of activities (discussions with experts and stakeholders, international conferences, travel to institutions in the country and abroad, publications). However, in order to disseminate the project, we

continued to develop the project's web page: <http://archaeoheritage.ro/>. The page contains a series of compartments (general information, plan activities, expected results, library, legislation, news, media monitoring and parliamentary debates). In a short time has become quite popular page, as can be seen from the following data:

Project's page contains some original compartments:

- a. First of all through this portal for the first time in Romania, is monitored media reflecting cultural heritage issues in general and archaeological heritage in particular. Storing these items on a single page allows analysis of the dynamics of public discussions, the diversity of issues approached, geographic distribution, etc. Finally, this area will facilitate the development of lines of research on media coverage of heritage issues.
- b. On the web page are placed the most recent publication around the world in research area of the protection and management of the archaeological heritage:

- c. The website is a bibliographic database that allows quick access to the persons interested in reference titles in the research area of the protection and management of the archaeological heritage <http://archaeoheritage.ro/bibliografie/>

The project's website contains the most comprehensive database of laws, first of all in Romania(over 100 laws, decisions of parliament, government decisions, orders of the Ministry of Culture, etc.), but also acts from Moldova and EU(Council of Europe and EU) and international conventions(UNESCO, ICOMOS, etc.) :

All components of the website are continually updated. Thus adding new data provides an actual, diversified and qualitative character of the project informational page.

1.2 Project promotion through international academic

The project was promoted at a range of international events, through the project overviews and scientific issues of protection of the archaeological heritage.

Conferences: In 2015 I participated in three international events with wide impact that facilitated both the presentation of the project results and establishment of new collaborative relationships:

Study visits: During 2015 I conducted two research visits one to UNESCO main office in Paris, France and the other one at the Institute of History of Lithuania, Vilnius:

- a. Between 2nd and 6th of June 2015 I conducted the research visit in the UNESCO main office in Paris, with the aim to develop the studies envisaged in the project. I have also talked with colleagues from UNESCO about the research and management problem of the archaeological heritage in France and World tendencies.
- b. Between the 6th and 15th of November 2015 I conducted research visit to Institute of Lithuanian History, Vilnius. I discussed with large number of colleagues from Parliament, Government, scholars from Vilnius University and Institute on various aspects of archaeological heritage legal framework and cultural heritage management in Lithuania.

2-3. RESEARCH OF NEW TRENDS ABOUT POLICIES FOR THE PROTECTION OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL HERITAGE IN EUROPEAN STATES AND CAPITALIZATION OF THE RESEARCH RESULTS

During 2015 were continued the research of European cultural policies and analysed the cultural policies of UNESCO. Thus, in 2015 the work of the project was focused on several areas of research related to the development of studies on the topic of the project and the development of basic research.

I managed to edit and publish the volume of the International Conference “Current trends in the archaeological heritage preservation: the national and the international perspectives”, Iasi 6th-10th of November 2013.
